This morning in worship I will be continuing our sermon series on the Apostles' Creed and the book of Romans with Part II of "Maker of Heaven and Earth." In today's scripture reading from Romans, the Apostle Paul makes several comments that relate to human sexuality; specifically about same sex sexual acts.

As we all know, anytime that we talk about controversial issues it is easy to make things personal. My suspicion is that some of you will appreciate my

comments today about this passage, while others will find my comments wanting in some way. It is not my intention to summarize the Bible today, nor is it my intention to make a statement about what Central believes about human sexuality as if there is only one opinion here. Instead, my hope is that my sermon today will express the issues that we believe were part of the context out of which Paul wrote, and the context of Rome to which he wrote. Similarly, I hope that my sermon will engage our current context of life and ministry in 2017. I will take scripture seriously. I will engage our tradition. I will reason with my mind and heart. I will test my reading of scripture through the experience of ministry.

Most of all, my sermon today will be grounded in our life together as a community of faith here at Central. At the end of the service, our mission will be the same as it was when we arrived this morning; to live out the good news of Jesus Christ in the world. I am grateful to be part of a church where we can engage difficult issues. I am even more proud to be part of a church where what matters most is our witness to Jesus Christ as people of faith.


Church-Wide Potluck

"Please plan on attending a called Charge Conference and church-wide potluck on **September 10th at 12:30pm** in the Life Center. We will discuss and vote on two financial requests from Saranam and enjoy food and fellowship time together.

I) Saranam, LLC Line of Credit: Since January this year, the Saranam Board has been discussing the benefits of having a line of credit to safeguard ourselves for expense and income timing differences. Having a LOC will help fill the gaps until the income comes in.

II) Saranam, LLC Expansion of Programming and Capital Campaign: Presentation of vision and plans to double programmatic capacity and request to change/update some language in legal originating documents accordingly. Because this will entail a large capital campaign from a very broad donor/volunteer and investor base, we request some minor changes to language in the originating legal documents to allow for options for asset distribution upon dissolution.

III) Saranam, LLC and Frances Thaxton Ash Homes, LLC also requests to change the legal title of the managing groups to "Board of Directors" from "Council on Homeless Ministries (CHM)."
